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**President Rafael Correa:**

What I have to say about the Ministry in Guayaquil, I already said.

The Chevron case, some videos were taken the other time. Look, we aren't going to fall into the trap. Do you know that we aren't part of the Chevron case? The Chevron case is between that oil company and the indigenous communities of the Amazon region, it's private. The government doesn't have anything to do with it. Of course I want our indigenous companions to win, but we have nothing to do with it. We are not a party to the case.

And Chevron, desperate to try to delay the proceedings, took some videos where there are representatives of the government. Who could it be? The person who's asking for bribes, where there's a representative of Alianza País at an office of Alianza País. Okay, let them tell us: Where's the office? Out comes a Mr. García, whom I have not had the dubious pleasure of meeting. Who might have pretended to be a representative of the government? We don't have anything to do with that, guys. We are not part of those proceedings. Those are private proceedings, but the oil company is desperate and they want to get us involved. So we're not going to fall into the trap.

This will be the first and last time I mention this case to state that Ecuador has nothing ... the Ecuadorian government has nothing to do with this case, it is not part of the proceedings and if anyone went to a meeting in the name of the government, okay, have that person put on trial, because he has nothing to do with the government and, the people named in that video, I don't even know them, guys, and we don't know them at the government level. The Chevron case.
